Executive Summary

- ▶ Hand-offs increase the risk of error
- ▶ Strategic changes ripple downstream in unexpected ways

When visibility and clarity are embedded:

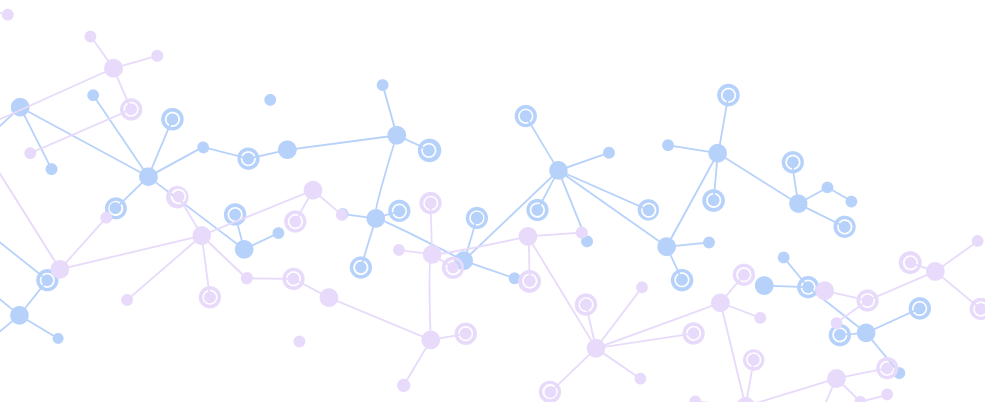
- ▶ Oversight is generated through normal execution
